Haden W. whose names are herewith annexed being appointed commissioners by the county court of Logan to divide the land and negroes of the estate of William Haden, was met at the residence of S. Haden in the County aforesaid, on the 11 day of June 1821 having been first sworn the said S. Haden of the themselves & Guardians there claiming a part of 5 negroes being named, we proceeded to make division of the negroes belonging to S. Haden as shown us for that purpose by his oldest administrator thereof after the widow Haden had been appointed, her the negroes remaining of S. estate were in number as follows Saml. Eliza Abiah Rachel & Eliza Lucy Henry & Eliza & Nancy & Saunders one much deceased Mitty David Stephen Jack Paddy Rachel Peggy Abrahams wife Thomas & Maria having wife Simon and his wife Paddy the elder & John which were first valued by us Separately and afterwards allotted amongst the said S. Haden to that value having some regard to amount due each heir and disposed to keep together mother & young child as far as possible so as to be justice amongst the heirs aforesaid Haden some of the children of S. Haden had by advance in his lifetime land, James Haden Joseph Haden John H. Haden children Saml. Haden John Wilson wife Paddy former Haden and not being willing to bring in to Hadenport the property they had rec^ded claimed apart in the present division not wanting their right in a division of S. estate property of S. estate hereof so that said negroes were delivered amongst the
