 mind after consulting my Body to the grace of my
 soul to God that gave it makes this my last
 will and testament (to wit) as to my worldly
 property in the first place give to my beloved
 wife Elizabeth Jackson and my negro woman
 by the name of Sarah I also give my 8th wife one
 Bay horse and one black mare one Bed & its
 furniture I also give her all the household
 and kitchen furniture. I also give her first
 choice of my stock of cattle I also give my
 waggan and work steers and the whole of
 my stock of hogs to my wife which property
 is above named my wife is liberty to dispose
 of as she may think proper. I give to my son
 Charles one negro Boy by the name of Peter one
 feather Bed and its furniture also three cows
 and to my son Samuel I give my negro Boy
 Dick and also the tract of land that I now
 live on containing two hundred and thirty two
 acres which land my wife is to have a prebendage
 on during her natural life I also give to Sam-
 uel one Bed and its furniture also one bay colt
 and a saddle and Bridle I also give said
 Samuel the balance of the cattle and for the
 execution of this my last will & testament I
 appoint my wife Elizabeth and my son Charles
 as Executors. I testimony whereof I set my hand
