 possessed of a sound mind, and knowing that it is
 appointed for all men once to die, therefore, I do make
 this my last will and Testament first I resign my

 the sum of one Dollar - I give likewise to my
 daughter Elizabeth Maxwell - all the sum of one Dollar -
 Likewise I give and bequeath to my daughter, Rebecca
 Maxwell all the sum of one Dollar - Likewise I give and bequeath

to my son Thomas Maxwell the sum of one Dollar

Likewise I give and bequeath to my son William Maxwell
 the one third of the Tract of Land I now
 live on or Tracts to be large of agreeable to quality & quantity
 Likewise I give and bequeath to my daughter, Daniel
 Maxwell all my House and Kitchen Furniture my
 Loom and gear, and one Hundred Dollars to be paid
 her by my Exec^s when the sale of the property be-
 comes due Likewise I give and bequeath to my son
 Andrew Maxwell two thirds of my Land I now
 live on being in two surveys and all my farming
 utensils - Likewise I give and bequeath to my
 daughter Rachel Maxwell all the sum of one
 Hundred Dollars to be paid to her by my Exec^s
 when the sale of my stock becomes due - I likewise appoint
 my son Andrew Maxwell my Executor of this my last
 will and Testament, and after he has paid all my
 just debts and each and every of those Bequeathing the
 remainder he is entitled to as a compensation for his
