I solemnly swear that I as clerk of said County Court do certify that the foregoing sale of the Goods of Wm Briggs was this day delivered to his heirs open Court and ordered to be recorded in the Court with this certificate standing truly recorded in my office Given under my hand this 5th day of June 1830

In the name of God Amen I the B. West of the County of Boone and State of Kentucky being involuntarily seized of the land hereunto called by the good and lawful reasons do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following. I give and bequeath to God that good my soul and my body to be buried in a decent manner and as my worldly goods after the payment of my debts I give as follows My land and here on I now live I give to my niece John Peak my Aunt Sally and Aunt Mary Peak to be equally divided between the three but my Aunt Sally and Aunt Mary Peak the house and the land and for I also give the land I bought of Arthur Slaughters and which is a Slaughters now living to my niece John Peak my daughter of Arthur Slaught but I give Arthur Slaught the liberty of selling the said land from year to year at any one time fourthly I give if he should choose to do so during the life of his present wife life or in case of her death during his widowhood and in case he should die and leave his wife a widow I give her his said wife Sally Slaughters my cousin the same liberty I also give the negro woman I bought of Arthur Slaughters named Kelly and two children named Mary and Catherine and all the increase they may have from the present date to be equally divided between the said John Peak my niece Sally Slaughters but I give Arthur Slaughters and Sally Slaughters the liberty of having the said increase at six months or yearly from year to year during my life or during widowhood in the same manner as the land I also devise that my negro girl named Charlotte shall serve my Aunt Sally and Aunt Mary during their lives and at their deaths to go free but if they should die before she the said Charlotte is twenty five she shall then serve my niece John till she is twenty five but if my niece John be not living she and her increase to go free at the death of my Aunt Sally I also give all my estate in Bullitt County Kentucky to be divided and given to my niece John Peak my daughter of Arthur Slaughters one fifth to John Peak my daughter of Arthur Slaughters one fifth to William Peak's one fifth to John Thoma's one fifth to Mary Ellen Short daughter of Wm Short I also give all my estate in the State of Ohio whether in land or money that land has been sold for to be divided one fourth to the benefit of the daughters of William Peak's one fourth to the benefit of Anne B. Slaughters William Slaughters and James Slaughters children of Arthur Slaughters one fourth to my niece John Peak my Aunt Sally and Aunt Mary Peak and to my niece John Peak one fourth to the first three hundred Dollars for furnishing the house I now live in to be taken out before any Division and all my estate in Washington County Kentucky I give
