 and all my Bank Stock in the Bank of Kentucky
 except so much of it as is herein after otherwise
 disposed of and it is my will and desire that all the
 property aforesaid be equally divided between my said
 children above named in the same manner as may be
 right I give and bequeath unto my son John George
 I call my Negro Girl Lavin to be disposed of by him
 in such manner as he may think proper I give
 and bequeath unto my son Lewis W. Lee two shares of
 my Bank Stock in the Bank of Kentucky and also
 my two Negro boys named Spencer and Croghan
 It is further my will and desire that so much of
 my Bank Stock aforesaid as will raise the sum of two
 hundred dollars be sold for that purpose, said sum of
 two hundred dollars I wish applied to my own use the
 balance of said Bank Stock being here disposed of as
 before stated I also give and bequeath to my daughter
 Elizabeth F. McKinnon my two bedsteads and furniture
 and I do hereby constitute and appoint Andrew P. Price
 and Samuel McKinnon Mallice my only Executors of this

my last will and Testament. In testimony whereof

In the name of God Amen I Charles Giltab of
England County Kentucky do this fourth day of
March one thousand eight hundred and twenty four
make and publish this my last will and Testament
in manner following. Revoking all others. Viz
1st It is my clearest that all my just debts shall be
paid and I leave to my wife Jane Giltab during her
life or widowhood the tract of land and plantation
to her. I now her containing two hundred acres more
or less with the farming utensils and household
and kitchen furniture belonging therunto also the
following Negroes viz Isabella, George, Aaron, Aaron
Nicholas & Moses with all my stock of horses cows
sheep & sheep except those which shall hereafter
be disposed of. 2nd I give to my daughter Rebecca
Giltab one feather bed and furniture as and it is my
will that she shall be supported out of the property
which I leave my wife during her life. 3rd I give
to my son & daughter Elizabeth the tract of land containing
two hundred acres
4th I give to my son Benjamin Giltab the tract of
land whereon he now lies containing one hundred &
five acres 5th I give to my daughter Elizabeth
Campbell the tract of land she now or containing
nearly three acres to her and the sum of her body
6th I give to my son Thomas Giltab one horse
and one saddle and feather bed and furniture one
hog pen and small pen and pair of Geese and one
cobbler in the tract of land I now live on which I leave to
my wife Jane Giltab containing two hundred acres more or

less from and after the decease of her mother 8th I
give to my daughter Polly Giltab one horse saddle
and bridle one feather bed and furniture one cow and
also money enough to buy her a hog pen and further
I leave to her during her life one Negro boy named
Moses and after her decease I give the said boy to the
lawful heirs of her body. 9th I leave to my daughter
Anniea Smith one hundred dollars in specie which
she has received also at the death of her mother I
leave to her one Negro boy named Nicholas during
her life & at her decease I give the said boy to the
lawful heirs of her body. 10 I leave to my daughter
Elizabeth Giltab one Negro boy named Jim during
her life which she has received at her decease I give the
said boy to her lawful heirs of her body. I leave my daughter
Sarah Wickham one Negro Girl named Martha
and which she had received during her life and at
her death I give the same Girl to the lawful heirs of her
body. 11 It is my will and desire that at the decease
of my wife Jane Giltab all my property of every
kind which is not otherwise disposed of shall be
divided amongst all my children so as to make them
as nearly equal as possible and a legacy which is
due me from my brother Benjamin Giltab & son
I give to my wife Jane Giltab one fifth part of said
legacy and the balance I desire to be divided in such
manner that none of my children who have no
land may come as nearly equal with those that have
as the balance of the cash left about 14 Dollars I do
hereby make and appoint my three sons Benjamin
& Thomas Benjamin Giltab and Thomas Giltab my sole
Executors of this my last will and Testament and they
& perking all other persons may do by me. In
