I Nancy Barlow being weak in body but in perfect mind at present make this my last will and Testament first I will my spirit to go that give it and my body to be buried in a Christian like order I will that Lawrence El. be my heir to all my negroes namely a negro man called by the name of Shiloh and also my bed and furniture all of which is in his possession at present for and in the consideration of his providing me in bed and bedding for the term of eighteen years also my negroes that may give to her the said Nancy Barlow from her father's debt in writing whereas I have herewith set my hand and affixed my seal this thirteenth of July 1824 in the presence of us

I John Barlow of the county of Logan and state of Kentucky being at present such but of perfect sound mind and memory think proper to make this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all others

Item 1 I by my perfect will and desire for my wife Elizabeth to keep all my earthly Estate together for the support of my children during my widow in her natural life

Item 2 If my wife should die before my youngest child should become of lawful age or get married I will my estate together with all the youngest child becomes of lawful age or gets married then for all my estate to be equally divided between my children

Item 3 If any of my children should get married before my youngest or should need any part of my estate I will my wife to judge of it and what can be paid to help them as she then may proper and keep every particular account of the same again as the same may be accounted in the division

Item 4 If my wife should get married before my youngest child may become of age in that case I wish my wife to have the third part of my estate during her life then to be equally divided between my children the latter one after taking my third part I wish to be kept together as named above and equally divided between my children as named above

Item 5 When the youngest becomes of age and gets married

Item 6 It is my wish for the houses plantation and all the land lying on the east side of the creek named now to be kept as a home for my wife and daughter as they may remain until the 1st of January 1824

I John Barlow of the county of Logan and state of Kentucky being in perfect health and sound mind and knowing the uncertainty of life and certainty of death do make this my last will and Testament in manner and to the effect as followeth

Item 1 It is my will and desire that all my just debts shall be paid by Executors to be hereafter named so soon after my death as may be

Item 2 I give and bequeath to my beloved wife during her natural life as long as she may continue single (and no longer) the plantation whereon I now live containing four hundred and forty or there abouts together with five (or six) of my negroes with all the house hold furniture plantation utensils and so much of the stock on the farm as she may think proper to keep

Item 3 I give and bequeath to my son William price children of my dear son John Barlow and Ben but in case of their death before they become of age or leaving heirs then it is my desire that the negro men named shall return to my estate

Item 4 I give and bequeath to my son Thomas the plantation bequeathed to my wife after her death or marriage as also one negro by name and known by the name of little Thomas and which I value to three hundred dollars
