I Nancy Barlow being weak in body but in perfect mind at present make this my last will and Testament first I will my spirit to go that give it and my body to be buried in a Christian like order I will that Lawrence El. be my heir to all my negroes namely a negro man called by the name of Shiloh and also my bed and furniture all of which is in his possession at present for and in the consideration of his providing me in bed and bedding for the term of eighteen years also my negroes that may give to her the said Nancy Barlow from her father's debt in writing whereas I have herewith set my hand and affixed my seal this thirteenth of July 1824 in the presence of us

I John Barlow of the county of Logan and state of Kentucky being at present such but of perfect sound mind and memory think proper to make this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all others

Item 1 I by my perfect will and desire for my wife Elizabeth to keep all my earthly Estate together for the support of my children during my widow in her natural life

Item 2 If my wife should die before my youngest child should become of lawful age or get married I will my estate together with all the youngest child becomes of lawful age or gets married then for all my estate to be equally divided between my children

Item 3 If any of my children should get married before my youngest or should need any part of my estate I will my wife to judge of it and what can be paid to help them as she then may proper and keep every particular account of the same again as the same may be accounted in the division

Item 4 If my wife should get married before my youngest child may become of age in that case I wish my wife to have the third part of my estate during her life then to be equally divided between my children the latter one after taking my third part I wish to be kept together as named above and equally divided between my children as named above

Item 5 When the youngest becomes of age and gets married

Item 6 It is my wish for the houses plantation and all the land lying on the east side of the creek named now to be kept as a home for my wife and daughter as they may remain until the 1st of January 1824

I John Barlow of the county of Logan and state of Kentucky being in perfect health and sound mind and knowing the uncertainty of life and certainty of death do make this my last will and Testament in manner and to the effect as followeth

Item 1 It is my will and desire that all my just debts shall be paid by Executors to be hereafter named so soon after my death as may be

Item 2 I give and bequeath to my beloved wife during her natural life as long as she may continue single (and no longer) the plantation whereon I now live containing four hundred and forty or there abouts together with five (5) of her choice of my negroes with all the house hold furniture plantation utensils and so much of the stock on the farm as she may think proper to keep

Item 3 To William and Mary Ann price children of my decd son John Barlow I give my negro Meman Fanny and her two children Abraham and Ben but in case of their death before they become of age or leaving heirs then it is my desire that the negro now named shall return to my estate

Item 4 I give and bequeath to my son Thomas the plantation bequeathed to my wife after her death or marriage as also one negro by name and known by the name of little Abam and which I value to three hundred dollars

Item It is my desire and will that when my son Thomas shall arrive to the age of twenty one he shall have the use and possession of one half of the plantation and thereby already till to his mother and it is also my will that my wife shall not sell out any part of my farm or house until it shall be my said son Thomas who shall pay her such rent yearly as two disinterested persons shall in their judgement be right I also give to my said son Thomas one bed and furniture to be worth fifty dollars

Item All the balance of my property of whatever kind and whosoever found not already disposed of I leave to my children Ann Johnson Daniel Price David Price Major Price Sucky Duncan Rice and Thomas Rice to be equally divided between them having into each the defendant sums already arranged them and which is appearing to Ann Johnson £185. So to Daniel Price £212 So to David Price £188 So to Major Price £196 So to Sucky Duncan £196 So to Rice £196 So to Thomas Rice £196 and to Thomas Rice including the negro and bed and furniture £1250 11 11 and further it is my will that after the death of my wife all the stock to which furniture and negroes that may be in her possession with all and every kind of property belonging to my estate shall be equally divided between my said children Ann Johnson Daniel Price David Price Major Price Sucky Duncan Rice and Thomas Rice.

It is my pleasure that if any meaning in my division of my estate should not clearly express as the law might require and any dispute should arise between my said sons as to my intention that it may be settled by three disinterested persons chosen by my executors to be called named in last I appoint my son Major Price and my friend Gabriel Taylor to my Executors of this my Will In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 16th day of September 1820

This Indenture made this Twenty Third day of June One thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty Five Witnesseth that I William Price of the County of Logan State of Kentucky considering the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death and being now weak of body but of sound mind do hereby declare this to be my last will and testament hereby ratifying all other

Item 1st I am all my last will and testament of opinion that the said will be read to me with great plainness and scintillation is in hand and one of the of them will be sufficient to pay all that I owe therefore I hereby declare that the said will be read and one of the of them for the said mentioned will be read but should the said will amount to more than the said will be read to me and privately of the said will I hereby declare my Executors to sell such of my property as they shall think most desirable to make up the amount.

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my wife Lucie Price all the property that I own in possession both personal and real during her natural life

Item 3rd I hereby empower my executors with the advice and consent of my son John Price to sell the land on which I now live together with the mill and other improvements and with the money in a good farm for the use of my wife Lucie Price but do not wish my executors to sell the said land until they think it can be done to advantage

Item 4th I hereby give and bequeath to my two sons John Price and Sucky Price all my real estate after the death of my wife which real estate is the place on which I now live but should the said will be read to me and one of the of them will be sufficient to pay all that I owe therefore I hereby declare the said farm will then constitute my real estate provided never the said my two daughters Elizabeth Price and Nancy Price shall be entitled to any part thereof and I hereby give and bequeath to my said daughter Elizabeth Price and Nancy Price all my personal estate but should the personal property not be equal to the value of the real property at the death of my wife I hereby direct my sons John Price and Sucky Price to pay unto them the said Elizabeth and Nancy as much as will make them all equal

Item 5th Should my wife see cause to marry again after my death I hereby empower my Executors to take all my property into their own hands for the benefit of my wife and children unless there is a reasonable prospect of the said property being used in consequence of such marriage I hereby request and appoint my friends Eli Branch and Ben Proctor to be the executors of this my last will and testament
