to my estate shall be equally divided between my said children
Ann Johnson Daniel Price David Price Major Price Lucy
Duncan Peter Price and Thomas Price.

It is my pleasure that if ~~any~~ meaning in my
desire of my estate should not be early exposed to the law
might require and any dispute should arise between my children
as to my intention that it may be settled by their being
trusted persons chosen by my executors to ~~be~~ ^{after} the named
Ann Johnson my son Major Price and my friend

be my executors and myself to be as far as a good farm as long as the
said farm will then constitute my real estate friends never the less shall
my two daughters Elizabeth Price and Frances Price share be entitled to an
equal share with their brothers in the estate after death of my wife
