

Item It is my desire and will that when my son Thomas shall arrive to the age of twenty one he shall have the use and possession of one half of the plantation and thereby already till to his mother and it is also my will that my wife shall not sell out any part of my farm or house until it shall be my said son Thomas who shall pay her such rent yearly as two disinterested persons shall in their judgement be right I also give to my said son Thomas one bed and furniture to be worth fifty dollars

Item All the balance of my property of whatever kind and whosoever found not already disposed of I leave to my children Ann Johnson Daniel Price David Price Major Price Sucky Duncan Rice and Thomas Rice to be equally divided between them having into each the defendant sums already arranged them and which is appearing to Ann Johnson £185. So to Daniel Price £212 So to David Price £188 So to Major Price £196 So to Sucky Duncan £196 So to Rice Price £110 So to Thomas Rice £110 including the negro and bed for him here £12 So to all and further it is my will that after the death of my wife all the stock to which furniture and negroes that may be in her possession with all and every kind of property belonging to my estate shall be equally divided between my said children Ann Johnson Daniel Price David Price Major Price Sucky Duncan Rice and Thomas Rice.

It is my pleasure that if any meaning in my decision of my estate should not clearly express as the law might require and any dispute should arise between my said wife as to my intention that it may be settled by three disinterested persons chosen by my executors to be called after named in last I appoint my son Major Price and my friend Gabriel Taylor to my Executors of this my Will In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 16th day of September 1820

This Indenture made this Twenty Third day of June One thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty Five Witnesseth that I William Price of the County of Logan State of Kentucky considering the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death and being now weak of body but of sound mind do hereby declare this to be my last will and testament hereby ratifying all other

Item 1st I am all my last will and testament of opinion that the said wife be paid to me with what plank and scantling is on hand and one half of the same will be sufficient to pay all that I owe through such my Executors to sell the plank and scantling and one fourth of the same for the above mentioned debts but should the debt which I owe amount to more than the debt due to me and privately of the above property I wish my Executors to sell such of my property as they shall think most desirable to make up the amount.

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my wife Lucie Price all the property that I own in possession both personal and real during her natural life

Item 3rd I hereby empower my executors with the advice and consent of my son John Price to sell the land on which I now live together with the mill and other improvements and with the money in a good farm for the use of my wife Lucie Price but do not wish my executors to sell the said land until they think it can be done to advantage

Item 4th I hereby give and bequeath to my two sons John Price and Sucky Price all my real estate after the death of my wife which real estate is the place on which I now live but should the said place be sold for a good farm as above directed the said farm will then constitute my real estate provided never the less that my two daughters Elizabeth Price and Nancy Price shall be entitled to an equal share with their brothers in the said estate after death of my wife and I hereby give and bequeath to my said daughter Elizabeth Price and Nancy Price all my personal estate but should the personal property not be equal to the value of the real property at the death of my wife I hereby direct my sons John Price and Sucky Price to pay unto their daughters Elizabeth and Nancy as much as will make them all equal

Item 5th Should my wife see cause to marry again after my death I hereby empower my Executors to take all my property into their own hands for the benefit of my wife and children unless there is a reasonable prospect of the said property being used in consequence of such marriage.
