I James Ball a citizen of Logan County and State of Kentucky being weak of body but of sound mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed for man to die do make this my last Will and Testament of -  
First I give my soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried agreeable to the direction of my Executors -

Secondly I do hereby give and bequeath to my Executors to dispose of my negroes and such of my property as best can be spared and with the proceeds thereof pay off my just debts -

Thirdly I give and bequeath to my wife fully all the remainder of my property to be undivided disposed of as she may think proper -

Fourthly I constitute and appoint my friend James Campbell the sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament and Guardian of my child and it is my request that the County Court of Logan County require no security of this my Executor for his true performance of the trust reposed in him - Signed sealed &c in the presence of

Item 1st I give my soul to God who gave it

Item 2nd I will that all my just debts be paid and the balance of my estate be disposed of in manner hereafter named

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my son fully William and one equal part of my land adjoining the Nelson Dub One horse named Charity One bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary that one equal part of my land and share her share good two cows & a bed & furniture also one chest to her and her heirs forever

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Williams one equal part of land and one bed and furniture one cow and two cows or the value thereof in money and further I will that after my debts are paid that the balance of my estate if any to be equally divided amongst my children hereafter named - Item 6th I hereby constitute this

my last Will and Testament subscribing and for me the said Christopher Williamson my Executors these I have under my hand this 29th April 1828
