 Item 7<sup>th</sup> My will & desire is that my executor see my debt of land lying in old debt book over and that after the payment my just debt out of the proceeds the balance to go to my wife towards her support & towards the support & schooling of my youngest son David whom he is to support & school out of the balance of my estate  
 Item 8<sup>th</sup> My will & desire further is that all the balance of my estate both real & personal here & elsewhere should remain with & the property of my beloved wife Lucy Albinson during her natural life or widowhood & after her death whatever balance may remain of that of my estate to be equally divided among my children that may then be living or the heirs of any of any that is now living - I whereas my son John Albinson some time last bought land a half a acre of land of John P. Thurnard for his good doctor which land was devised for my benefit - I wish that the money should be paid out of my estate by John Albinson making the title to my wife her life & to go to my heirs at her death - I also desire that my son John Albinson should live with his mother & manage her estate & take care of her & the family & that she should allow him a compensation worth his trouble
