It James Ball a citizen of Logan County and State of Kentucky, being made
fully but of sound mind and memory and knowing that it is appropriate
for him to do so make this my last will and testament of—
That I give my land to that who gave it and my body to the earth to be
buried agreeable to the direction of my Executors—

Secondly It is my will that my Executors dispose of my negroes and land and such of my property as best can be appeared and with the proceeds thereof pay off my just debts —

Thirdly I give and bequeath to my wife fully Well all the remainder of my property to be used and disposed off as she may think proper—

Publicly constitute and appoint my friend James Conitzer
the sole executor of this my last will and Testament and Guardian
of my child and it is my request that the County Court of Logan
County require and security of this my Executor for his true perform-
ance of the trust reposed in him— Signed Execd &c in the presence

of Samuel Nelson

On the manuscript of David Thompson (Williamson) knowing the fault of most and that it is appointed for all the living to die being of weak body but of sound mind do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows (namely)

Step 1st I give myself to God who gave it

And^d I will that all my quit abatto be payed and the balance
of my Estate be disposed of manner hereafter named

Then 3^d I give and bequeath to my son Tully William word One equal part of my land adjoining the Willow Bush One horse named Chazy One bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever

Wm^d I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary that one equal
part of my land and I have therefore given her two cows & one bed & furniture
also one chest to her & her heirs forever

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Williams
one equal part of land and one red and furniture Chestnut and two cows
valued as the value thereof now and further Service that after my
debt are payed that the balance of my estate if any to be equally divid
amongst my children hereafter named. Item 6th March 1812 this

my last Will and Testament abating all former Wills my appoint James
Hunt as my Executor these Powers under my hand this 29th April 1838
