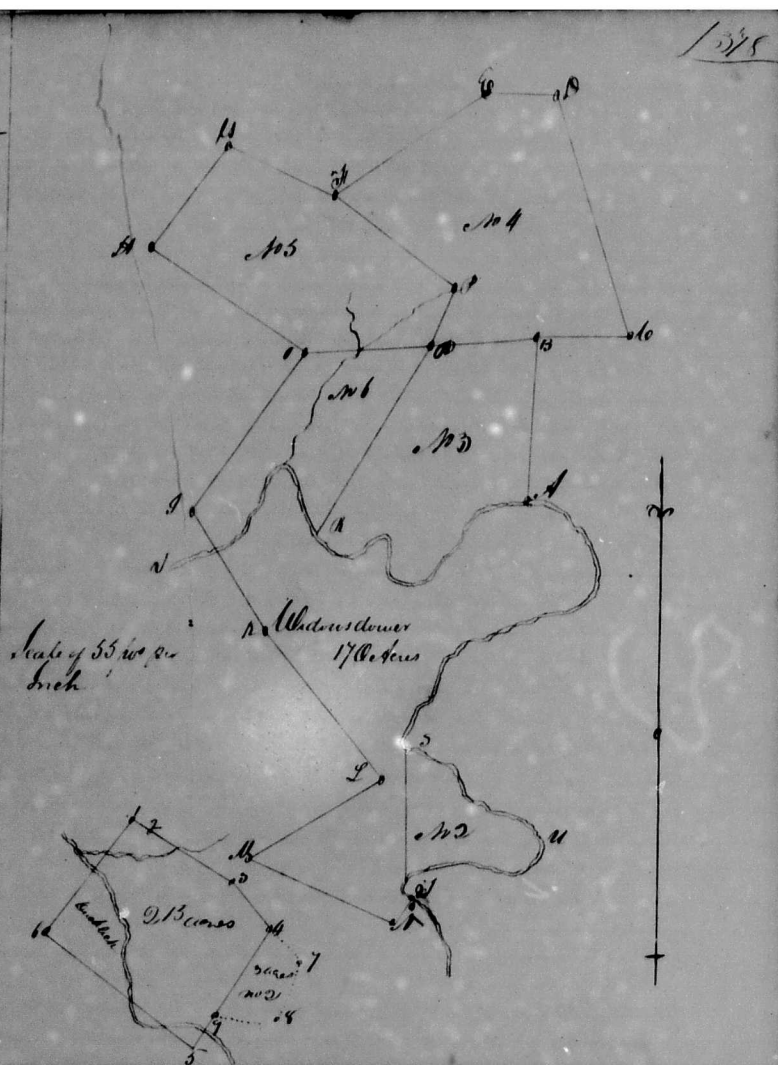

Agreeably to an order of the Towns Meeting, the undersigned Commissioners to make division of the lands of Philip Kennedy, died, and assign to the widow of the decedent her dower in said lands. We in the first place proceeded and surveyed the whole of the lands, Town of 377 conveyed by Edson Thompson in his deeds. 100 Acres surveyed for Philip Kennedy and a Battle Runway Certificate bounded as followeth Beginning at a point on the N. E. side of the Little Rock River, namely in the lower corner to Pollards meadow, survey owned by John Smith, thence an oblique survey 114 1/2 poles to a white oak corner to Smith thence on a line of the same 119 1/2 poles to a large white oak thence 116 1/2 poles to a post oak thence thence about 56 poles to a sugar tree on the hill knob thence 53 1/2 poles to an oak post oak thence 165 1/2 poles to a white oak corner to John mcd thence 108 1/2 poles to a white oak on Brants line thence 153 1/2 poles to two white oaks, corner to Brant thence 134 1/2 poles
