Logan County, State of Kentucky

Agreeable to an order of the Logan County Court of Logan County, November Term 1827, this docket we have surveyed and divided a 1000 acre survey of Military Land lying in Logan County and on the waters of Casper river. The corners and distances of the original survey beginning at a white Oak and white mulberry and two poplars standing on the west side of Casper river below the mouth of the rock house fork running up the river N 88° E 110 poles S 75° E 38 poles S 16° N 28 poles to a post Oak thence S 58° N 17 poles S 28° W 11 poles S 51° N 56 poles S 58° N 30 poles S 15° N 11 poles S 15° N 120 poles S 57° N 80 poles crossing the river twice South 26 poles to two Elms a sugar tree and poplar on the west bank of the river thence out N 63° N 333 poles to a large white and sugar tree thence S 56° N 11 poles to a hickory and red Oak thence S 89 poles to two hickories and a poplar thence S 16° N 365 poles to a post Oak and black Oak together thence S 16° E 610 poles to the Beginning containing by survey 1022 acres. The divided land surveys as follows—

Lot No. 1 Beginning at two hickories and a poplar south west corner to the original survey running thence N 16° E 315 poles to a post Oak and black Oak together thence S 17° E 57 poles to a stake on the original line and corner with Lot No. 2 thence S 16° N 30 poles to a stake on the original line thence West 17 poles to the Beginning containing 24 acres and was allotted to Joseph Roberts.

Lot No. 2 Beginning at a sugar tree and large Ash running thence N 17° E 36 poles to a white Oak and white mulberry on the original line and with it N 17° N 55 poles to a stake corner to Lot No. 1 thence S 16° N 33 poles to a stake on the original line thence East 57 poles to a hickory and red Oak thence N 25° E 11 poles S 61 poles to the Beginning containing 10 acres and was allotted to Benjamin Roberts and Lina A Roberts heirs of Lina Roberts and Lina Roberts was wife of William Roberts.

Lot No. 3 Beginning at a large ash and sugar tree Beginning corner to Lot No. 2 running thence S 15° E 53 poles to a white Oak and Elm thence N 7° E 247 poles to two hickories and a poplar together thence N 16° N 57 poles to a white Oak and white mulberry corner to Lot No. 2 thence S 17° N 123 poles to the Beginning containing 11 acres and was allotted to Susan Woodard formerly Lina Roberts.

Lot No. 4 Beginning at a white Oak and two hickories on the north side of the river running thence with the line of that survey N 7° E 227 poles to

three hickories and a poplar corner to Lot No. 3 thence S 16° E 37 poles to a gum and red Oak thence S 17° N 258 poles to three post Oaks on the original line and with it N 13° N 57 poles to the Beginning containing 74 acres and was allotted to Benjamin Roberts.

Lot No. 5 Beginning at an Elm and red Oak standing on the south side of the rock house fork and on the east boundary line of Lot No. 4 running thence S 17° E 190 poles to a chestnut and two poplars on the east boundary line of Lot No. 4 thence with that line S 17° E 117 poles to a stake by a long stump on the original line thence S 16° N 367 poles to gum and red Oak corner to Lot No. 4 and with a line of that survey Lot No. 5 1112 poles to the Beginning 138 acres and was allotted to Benjamin Roberts.

Lot No. 6 Beginning at a Elm and red Oak Beginning corner to Lot No. 5 running with the south boundary line of that survey N 16° E 110 poles to two corner a chestnut and two poplars thence S 58° N 17 poles to a black Oak and hickory on the original line thence with it N 13° N 185 poles to three post Oaks corner to Lot No. 7 thence S 17° E 135 poles to the Beginning containing 160 acres and was allotted to Susan Woodard, B. Roberts, B. Roberts and Lina Roberts heirs of Lina Roberts formerly Lina Roberts.

Lot No. 7 Beginning at a white walnut and two poplars the Beginning corner of the original survey running thence N 16° N 60 poles to a stake by a stump corner to Lot No. 6 running thence with that lot and Lot No. 6 S 17° N 282 poles to a black Oak hickory corner to Lot No. 8 on the original line thence S 13° E 67 poles to two Elms a hickory and poplar on the west bank of Casper river thence North 25 poles thence N 56° E 88 poles to a white Oak and hickory on the river bank by a bluff thence N 55° N 56 poles to a white Oak thence S 14° E 168 poles to a hickory and hickory on the bank of the river thence down the river N 28° W 80 poles to the Beginning containing 177 acres and was allotted to Baylor B. Roberts and Lina Roberts heirs of Lina Roberts.

Lot No. 8 Beginning at a white Oak and hickory on the bank of the bluff corner to Lot No. 7 running with a line of that survey N 33° N 36 poles to a white Oak corner to land survey thence with and other of its lines N 47° E 168 poles to a hickory and hickory on the river bank thence up the river S 28° E 7 poles thence S 15° E 38 poles to a white Oak thence S 10° N 52 poles thence S 15° N 40 poles thence S 16° N 50 poles thence S 33° N 30 poles N 5° N 40 poles thence S 15° N 20 poles to the Beginning containing one hundred acres and was allotted to John Phelps Roberts and Alfred Lewis Roberts infant heirs of Alfred Roberts Dec. November 13th 1827.
