Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret one and one half dozen plates one set of china cups and saucers one set of my cupboard ware and one set of knives and forks

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth one and one half dozen plates one set of china cups and saucers one set of my cupboard ware and one set of knives and forks

Item 5th I have my crop to be equally divided between my son William Henry and my two daughters Margaret and Elizabeth.

When I have all the balance of my property that is not otherwise disposed of by the will of my husband (William Henry Gough) I leave to be equally divided among my seven children (Robert Henry Gough, James Gough, William Henry Gough, Mary Gough, Elizabeth Gough, Henry Gough, and I appoint my trusty friend Joseph Bush the executor of this my last & testament

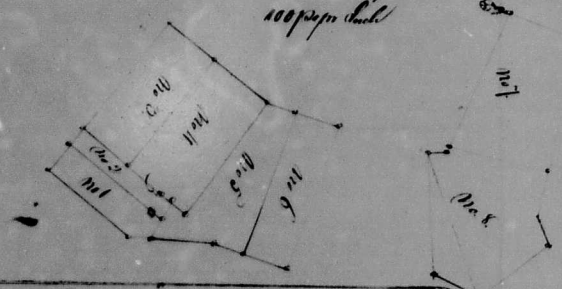
