In the name of God amen—being greatly afflicted in body but sound in mind I Martin Kelly of the County of Logan & State of Kentucky, do hereby make declare & publish this as my last will & Testament hereby revoking & rescinding all former wills or parts of Wills by me heretofore made viz I leave & bequeath to my beloved wife Rebecca Kelly forever all that property of every kind whatsoever & its increase hereby as a hereafter, consisting of negroes household & kitchen furniture etc etc I received by her at my matrimony with her and I give also to her also the two Bows which I & she have All the Farming implements and

all the cattle & Hogs which I now own - I have given to her the whole of my crop now growing on the farm on which I now live. I also give to my dear wife to be her & her heirs forever the one half of the tract of land on which I now live including the dwelling house & the other buildings and a reasonable portion of the cleared land of the farm.

After paying all my just debts out of the residue of all my property not included in the above I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary St. Croix & her heirs all that residue of my property of any kind kind & goods lands or of any other description which remains to be her & her heirs forever.

I have hereby appointed and named my son Law Parson & Bradock and my friends Richd. Pitt & James Allison executors of this my last Will & Testament.
