

I give to my son David Williams one negro girl named Clancy to him & his heirs forever also when she comes of age or should and then one horse & saddle worth Sixty Dollars & a feather Bed & furniture -

Item 7th My will & desire is that my Executors see my tract of land lying on itself ticks creek and that after the payment my just debts out of the proceeds the balance to go to my wife towards her support & towards the support & schooling of my youngest son David whom I wish supported & schooled out of the balance of my estate

Item 8th My will & desire further is that all the balance of my estate both real & personal here & elsewhere should remain with & the property of my beloved wife Lucy Williams during her natural life or widowhood & after her death whatever balance may remain of that of my estate to be equally divided among my children that may then be living or the heirs of any of any that is now living - & whereas my son John Williams some time last brought down a half a acre of land of John P. Thumard for his & his descendants which Land was devised for my benefit - I wish that the money should be paid out of my estate by J^o Williams making the title to my wife her life & to go to my heirs at her death - I also desire that my son John Williams should live with his mother & manage her estate & take care of her & the family & that she should allow him a compensation worth his trouble

Item 9th Lastly I appoint my two sons J^o Williams & W^m Williams my executors to this my last will & testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 25th day of March 1828
