In the name of God Amen - I Thomas Stubbfield of the County of Logan & State of Kentucky, being at this present time of sound mind & memory thanks to almighty God, do make known this my last will & testament hereby revoking all others by me heretofore made viz,

I recommend my soul to almighty God who gave it and am pleased to do no other deed -

My will & desire is that my beloved wife Hannah Stubbfield enjoy the whole of my estate both real & personal until my nephew John Long Jr. whom I have named shall come to age of twenty one years at which time my will & desire is that my said nephew John Long Jr. shall receive one half of my estate, that is my land and negroes, the other half to remain in the hands of my beloved wife Hannah Stubbfield during her natural life, and at her death to go to the said John Long Jr. to him & his heirs forever -

My will & desire is that my beloved wife Hannah Stubbfield have the entire disposal of all the perishable part of my estate, and that she find board school and clothing for my nephew John Long Jr. until he arrives to the age of twenty one years. My understanding is that my beloved wife Hannah Stubbfield may in any way she may think proper dispose of all and every part of the perishable part of my estate - and that no inventory or appraisement be made or taken on that part of my estate viz, the whole of the perishable part thereof -

My will & desire is that if my nephew John Long Jr. should die before he arrives to the age of twenty one years - or without lawful heirs - My will & desire is that all and every part of my estate above bequeathed to him be equally divided between the children of my brother John Long Sr. at the death of my beloved wife Hannah Stubbfield, but should my nephew John Long Jr. die without lawful heirs after receiving a part of my estate, then my wife then be living, my will and desire is that it return to my beloved wife Hannah Stubbfield during her natural life, then to be
