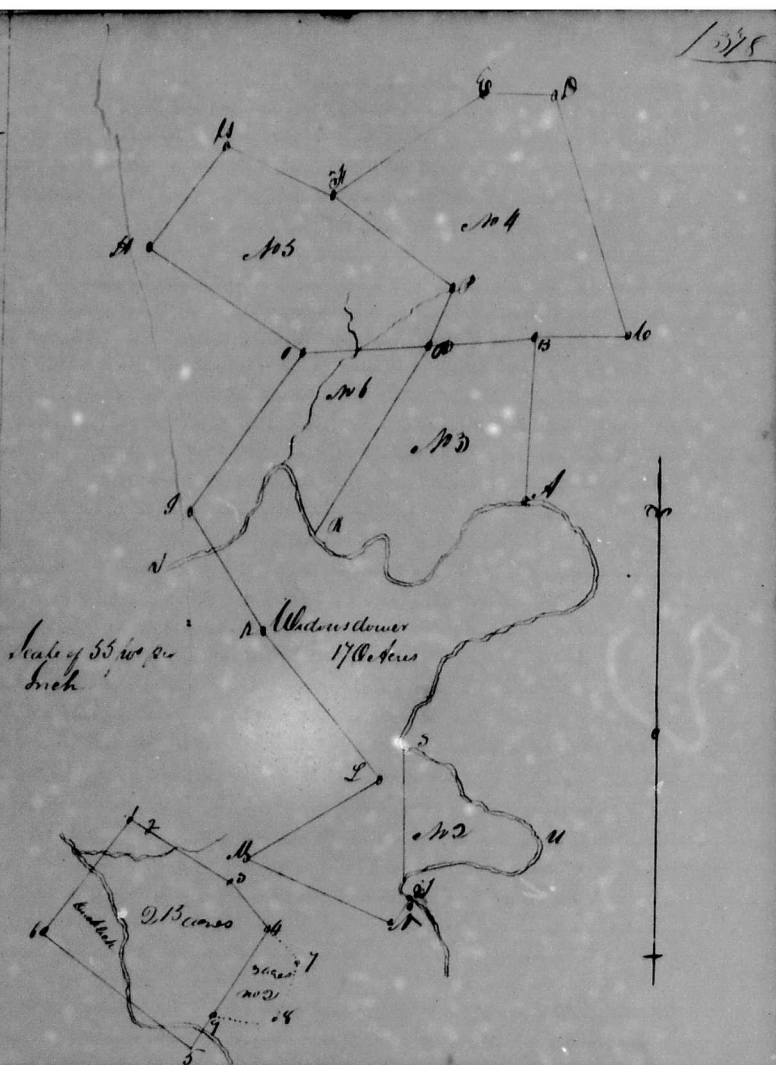

Agreed to an order of the Logan County Court appointing the undersigned commissioners to make division of the lands of Philip Kennedy, dec'd, and assign to the widow of the decedent her share in said lands. We at the first place proceeded and surveyed the whole of the lands, Town of 37th conveyed by Gibson Thompson in two deeds. 108 acres surveyed for Philip Kennedy and a Battle Runway Certificate bounded as followeth Beginning at a point on the N^W 1/4 of the Eithbert John's usually now known corner to Pollards section, survey owned by John Smith, thence an old line of town Survey 11 1/2 108 poles to a white oak corner to Smith thence on a line of the same 119 60 poles to a large white oak thence 116 11 1/2 poles to a post oak thence thence about 56 poles to a sugar tree on the back knob thence 53 60 118 poles to an oak & post oak thence 165 10 1/2 poles to an oak corner to John mcd thence 158 10 1/2 poles to a white oak on Bruests line thence 153 6 12 1/2 poles to two white oaks, corner to Bruest thence 134 10 1/2 p.

to a sugar tree white oak corner to James Hendry, thence S 50 E 58
poles to a poplar corner to Hendry, thence S 86 E 68 poles to a
white oak & dogwood corner to Hendry, thence S 86 W 106 poles to
a stake in a field, thence S 67 E 103 poles to an ash & sugar tree
by Mrs Harvats fence, thence S 39 E 26 poles to two beeches on the bank
of the creek, thence down with the meanders thereof to the Beginning
of the line other survey are patented to John & M^cCallister for 200

 Lett 5 Begins at a hickory at Harris Spring, corner to Lett No 4, thence
 1577 1847 poles to an ash & post oak, thence 165 1774 poles to an ash
 & sugar tree, then north, thence 588 753 poles to white oak on Bristol line
 thence on his line 135 6130 po to two white oaks corner to Post Lett No 6
 thence on Lett No 6 588 680 poles to a larger tree, black oak on the oak
 corner to Lett No 3 & 16, thence on Lett No 1 133 to 44 poles to the Beginning
