I me I William Fletcher of Madison County being very sick and Weak, but of perfect mind and Memory Thanks be given unto God calling unto mind the Mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men Once to die to make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and Recommend my Soul into the hand of Allmighty god that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the Discretion of my executors Nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive the Same Again by the mighty Power of god and as touching such worldly Estate where with it hath pleased God to bless me with I give devise and dispose of the Same in the following manner First I give a bequeath to Wm my beloved wife the lot of land in Mounsbrough on which we now live with the Improvements and all Emolument arising therefrom And I give to my beloved Sons John James Robert William all my Land on Sullivan's Water entire in my Own name and Trust
