Calling unto mind the mortality of my Body and Knowing that is Appointed for all men once to die do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I Give and Recommend my soul in to the hand of Almighty God that ^{now} and my Body I Recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the direction of my Executors nothing setting but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life I Give, Grant and Dispose of the same in the following manner and form first I Give and Bequeath to Katy Moody my dearly Beloved wife the Plantation

I now live on together with all my household goods Debts and mortgage effects also hives cattle and hogs to be wholly in her possession and at her Disposal in order to assist her in raising her five small children and when my beloved Son Isaac has arrived at the age of twenty one years my said Beloved wife shall have her Power to take a third part or a child's part of said Estate Secondly if my Black mare should bring a colt the coming Spring I Give and Bequeath the same Together with all my Body Belonging to my well beloved son Andrew Moody thirdly I constitute make and Ordain my said Beloved wife Katy Moody Together with James Anderson the sole Executors of this my last will and Testament and I do hereby fully disavow revoke and Disavow all and every other former Testament wills Legacies Bequeaths and Executors by me in any wise before named and Bequeathed Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this second day of February one thousand eight hundred
