In the name of God Amen I Samuel Thompson of the County of Madison and State of Kentucky being very sick and weak but in perfect mind and memory Thanks be given unto God. Calling into mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and Ordain this my Last Will and that is to say principally and first of all I give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of the almighty God that gave it and my body I Recommend to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power

In the Name of god Amen. I Amstead Blackwell
of the County of Madison and State of Kentucky being
in a weak and low State of health, but of a perfect
and sound Mind and Memory do make this my
last Will & Testament, hereby Revoking all former
Will or Wills by me made and do hereby Order
and Direct my worldly Goods and Property to be
disposed of in manner & form following that is
my will & Desire is that all my Property both real
& personal be Equally divided Between my children
namely William, Nancy, Randolph, Fekiel, David
Sally & John which I give to them and their
heirs forever except the use thereof which I reserve
for the Purpose and for the time following that is
to say my will and Desire is that my beloved wife
Dicy Chammann shall have the use & benefit of
the houses & Plantation where I now live together with
all my Estate both Real & Personal during her life
or her Containing my Widow; and then my Estate
to be Divided as before directed Lastly my will
and Desire is that my son William Blackwell
& John Sappington, shall be my Executors to carry
into effect this my last will & Testament. In Testimo-
ny whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
my seal this fifth day of May one thousand seven hundred
and ninety four
