-ters to wit, Eliza, Sabra, Franky, Susan, Mildred
Tomlinson, Betty Vester, Amy, Mary, Agatha
Turner & Molly Watts, and their heirs forever but if in
Case my youngest daughter die before she have an
heir Lawfully begotten of her body her part to be ^{equally} ~~equally~~
divided Between my Other Daughters and their heirs
that then Survives
