

In the name of God Amen, I Christopher Harris being through the Abundant Mercy and goodness of God the Weak in body yet of perfect understanding and memory do constitute this my last Will & Testament and desire it should be Received by all as such, Imprimis that I will & desire that my first Children (viz) Dabney Harris, Sarah Martin, Robert Harris, Mourning Jones, Christopher Harris, & Mary Jones should have the following Negroes (excepting thirty pounds out of my Son Dabneys Legacy which is to be paid by the Executors of this Part of my Will for the use & Benefit of my wife and Other Children viz, Ritten and her children Pomp, Moses, Alice, George, Betty, Lucy and Delphy the Above Negroes to be Divided Agreeable to Cornelius Dabneys Seniors Will and I do Appoint Foster Jones, and Christoph Harris as Executors of the the above part of this Will and as to the Ballance of my Estate I direct that first my Debts shall be paid out of what money I have by or is Owning to me the house where I live I direct should be finished which together with the tract of land whereon I live I leave to my Dear Loving wife during her life and at her death to Son Overton Harris as to the Ballance of my Negroes (David, Kate, Fanny, Stephens and Eddy together with my House hold furniture Stock of every kind and Plantation Utensels I desire that my wife may have the whole Benefit of them during her life or Widowhood and if she should Marry the whole to be sold and Equally Divided amongst her Other Children as to my Lands on Muddy Creek and Begueth him as follows the Do my Creek tract of land

I will and Bequeath to my son John Harris the Spring Tract to my son Benjamin Harris the tract on which my son ~~Wm~~ has built to my son William Harris and the Tract called the Holly Tract to my son Barnabas Harris and my land in Albemarle County together with the Stock that is thereon I direct shall be sold and that my son James and Samuel Harris shall Receive of the money as much as led John Miller & Robert Rhodes shall Judge the Land to be worth that I will & to my Other sons viz to be made Equal to them, as to my three Daughters viz Jane Gentry Margot Harris, and Isabel Harris my will and desire is that Jane Gentry should Receive ten pounds and Margot and Isabel Harris to have fifty pounds apiece out of the Ballance of what my Albemarle land and the Profits arising from that place and if that should not be sufficient that it shall be made up to them out of any of Personal Estate that my wife and Executors after mentioned shall think best as to my Lands on Licking Waters my Will is that if they are Obtained it should be sold and Equally divided Amongst my last set of Children and I do Appoint my dear & Loving wife with John Sappington and John Harris to execute that part of my will that respects my wife and her Children as Witness my hand & Seal this twentieth day of February one thousand seven hundred and ninety four

In the name of God Amen Isaac Burgin of the County of Madison Tennessee being very Sick and Weak in body but of Perfect mind and memory Thanks be given unto God having into mind the Mortality of my body and knowing that it is Appointed unto all men once to die, do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament That is to say Principally and first of all, I give and Recommend my Soul into the hand of Almighty God that gave it and my body I Recommend to his edith to be Buried in a decent Christian Burial at the Discretion of my executors nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive the Same Again by the mighty Power of god and as Touching such Worldly estate as it hath Pleased god to bless me with in his life, I give devise and dispose of the Same in the following Manner I give after all my Lawfull Debts are paid first of all I give and bequeath to my Dearlly Beloved Daughter Nancy Burgin, a two year Old mare Colt a grey and to my dear Beloved Wife Mary Burgin all my Lands moveable Property and a negro boy named Jupiter by her self to be Possed and enjoyed during her widowhood only (whom I likewise constitute my sole and Ordain to be my Executrix and Annis Burgin my Executor) and if she Marries I give her all the Ruttle and house hold furniture and a soul horse with a black face and sheep and hogs if she keeps and maintains the Children and the Children to be schooled out of the rent of land and the hire of the Negroes, During her Widowhood, she may send the Children out of any Property that may be most convenient and after her death all the Real and personal Estate to be sold and equally Divided amongst my Children and I do hereby, utterly disallow revoke & disannul all and every Other former Testaments Wills and
