I Daniel Maupin of Madison County & State of Kentucky being of Sound mind though weak in body Considering the certainty of Death & the uncertainty of when it may happen have thought fit to make this my last will & testament in the following manner that is to say I give & bequeath unto Margaret Burnett the fifty Acres of land that I live on so long as she lives & is single & at her death or Marriage I bequeath it to her Daughter Lucy Burnett to her sole use & behoof & request & my will further is that all & every part of my personal Estate Should be sold & equally divided amongst my five Daughters or their heirs viz Sarah Stephenson Margaret Burnett Elizabeth Rays Children Mary Goulding & Fanny Lyych After my debts is paid which is to be paid out of my Personal estate & the sum of twelve pounds due from me to Lucy Burnett is to be paid her out of the same with my funeral expence by my executor hereafter named & that no Misunderstanding may take place in the construction of this will it is to be understood that Elizabeth Rays two Children are to stand as one legatee in the above distribution & finally I resign my Soul to God Trusting through the mediation of his son to enjoy Eternal life & I hereby appoint my friend John Harris to be my Executor in this my last will & testament which I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twentieth day of October one thousand eight hundred & two
