This Will of Edward Stephenson Deceased on the 10th day of August 1792 his devise was of the division of his Estate that is as follows that two Bonds should be sold and Equally divided amongst his children the one on Davis and the other on Brooks likewise his children should have there clothes and his daughter Betty should have a Saddle that was making and his son William have a Sute of cloathes that he had bought for him self and that his wife should keep full possession of his Estate to Rase the children and as long as she lives Likewise that John Saddy James Stephenson and his son William Stephenson should Administer on his Estate
