 of Fayette, being in Perfect Health of body and of Perfect mind
 and Memory thanks be given unto god calling unto mind
 the Mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed
 for all men Once to die, do make and Ordain this my last
 Will and Testament that is to say principally and first
 of all I give & Recommend my soul into the hand of Almighty
 god that gave it. and my body I recommend to the earth
 to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the discretion
 of my Executors nothing Doubting but at the General

Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of god, and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath Pleased god to bless me in this life I give devise and Dispose of the same in the following manner and form, First I give and bequeath to my beloved Niece Betsy Fox daughter to my half Brother Samuel Fox a late emigrant from Hanover County, A Negro Woman Slaves named Milley together with her child a boy named Amstead, with the future Increase of the said Milley to her she and heirs forever Also I give to my beloved Niece Rebekah Farthing Daughter to my half sister Ann Farthing of James City County, A Negro boy named Pambin to her she and heirs forever Also I give to my beloved Niece Betsy Piggott daughter to my Sister Mary Piggott of the City of Williamsburg, a Negro boy named George to her she and heirs forever Also I give to my beloved Brother Isham Bridges whom I likewise constitute make and Ordain, the sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament, all singular my Books Furniture, profits claims of any kind stock of any kind I may die possessed of, Debts dues or Demands of any nature together with my wearing Apparel Working tools and all and every other Article or Articles I may at this or any other time be possessed with to him she and heirs forever, And I do hereby disallow revoke and Disannul all and every other former Testaments Wills Legacies Bequests and Executors by me in any ways before made, Willed and bequeathed: Ratifying and confirming this and nothing to be my last Will & Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this seventh day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred ninety George Bridges off

As the Amear was wrote by my own hand if any dispute should arise I hope the hand Writing can be proved with out much trouble Should I not Return from the Campaign I expect to go on the 10th Inst. in my desire this may lie over without being proved or Divided till full 1798
