Attest Will Irvine and Testament
In the name of God Amen I Samuel Thompson of the County of
Madison and State of Kentucky being very sick and weak but in perfect
mind and Memory Thanks be given unto God. Calling into mind
the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all
men once to die do make and Ordain this my Last Will and
that is to say principally and first of all I give and Recommend
my Soul into the hands of the almighty God that gave it and my
body I Recommend to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial
at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general
Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power

374/ power of God and as beeching such worldly Estate wherewith
 hath pleased god to bless me in this life. I give demise and dispose
 of the same in the following manner and form. First I give and
 bequeath to Minny my dearly beloved wife, one feather bed and
 furniture and the corn that is left, after paying the Rent and
 Ten Dollars that Benjamin Moore owes to me out of eleven
 Dollars and nine Dollars out of Ten, that my son Elias
 Harrison owes to me, and all that William Asper owes me
 which money I have paid for him, which I have paid for him as a
 security and Thirty three pounds six shillings on the Estate of
 Matthew Garret Deceased, and all my clothing to be raised
 and levied out of my Estate together with all my household
 goods debts and movable effects, also I give my Daughter Polly
 eleven five shillings and my son Robert Harrison five shillings
 and my son Elias Harrison five shillings and my
 Daughter Charlotte five shillings and I do hereby ratify disallow
 revoke and disannul all and every other former Testaments
 Wills legacies requests and bequests by me in any wise before
 named, made and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this
 and no other to be my last will and Testament, In
 Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
 seventh day of September in the year of our lord eighteen hundred and
 eighty eight ^{signed, sealed and published} and James Harrison as his last
 will and Testament in the presence of ^{three} who in his presence
 and in the presence of each other, have hereunto subscribed our
 names and my wife and Joseph Williams ^{Witness} and
 Benjamin Moore ^{Witness} and Polly Williams ^{Witness}
