be equally divided among my six sons and if the property do not amount to the purchase money of the land which cost Benjamins part one hundred and fifty pounds and the other that is to say Thomas and James three hundred pounds they are to make the three youngest parts equal to the three oldest theirs part by paying back to the youngest three as much as making my six sons equal and my two daughters that live with me is to have their body clothing exclusive also I constitute make ordain and appoint my three oldest sons Benjamin Thomas and James Scovener my sole executor of this my last Will and Testament and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and Disannul all and every other former Testament wills legacies bequeaths and executor by me in any wise by me named willed and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty third day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred Signed sealed & Published pronounced and declared by the said James Scovener as his last will and Testament in the presence of us who in his presence and in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names That Benjamin Estle Jonathan Estle Alexander Gaston
