In the name of god Amen I Joseph McKenney of Madison County and State of Virginia being of Perfect health and the Present exigencies of Affairs Requiring as well as Knowledge the Mortality of my body I do hereby constitute and Ordain this to be my last Will and Testament, and first I do hereby constitute and Ordain James Crawford of Madison County my trusty friend to be my Executor and to do and cause to be done all things Agreeable to this my last will and Testament and give I Will and bequeath to my well beloved Henry all my Lands as well in Kentucky as North Carolina Saving him my said Brother paying to my first fifteen fifty pounds North Carolina currency each and my Honoured Mother I lend my Negro fellow August During her Widowhood and After that Period of time to be sold to the Best Advantage and the due to be Equally divided Betwixt my four sisters and should my Mother never Marry at her decease my Negro fellow to be sold and Divided as Above directed and further I Will and bequeath to my Dearlly Beloved Sister Hannah and Elizabeth my Negroes Wench Le and her child to wit my sister Hannah to have Lece and Elizabeth the child Over and Above their dividend as Above directed and all the residue of my Moveable Estate together with all the Debts due to me I Will and bequeath to my said Brother Henry McKenney After him paying all my Just Debts and I do hereby constitute and Ordain this to be my last Will and Testament Revoking all Other Wills and Testaments and Confirming this only in Witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this sixth day of May one thousand seven hundred and ninety six

In the name of god Amen I John Province of the County of Madison and State of Virginia being Weak in body but of a sound and Disposing Memory Calling to mind the Mortality of my body knowing that it is Appointed for all men Once to die do make constitute and Ordain this to be my last will and Testament that is to say Principally and first of all I give and Recommend my soul into the care of Almighty god that gave it and my body to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors and as touching such worldly Treasures as god has pleased to Bless me with I this day dispose of in the following manner and form, first of all I allow as many of my Horses to be sold as will pay my Just debts Secondly I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary During her Widowhood the Plantation on which I now live with all the farming Utensils with the still and Vials Also one Negro Girl named Luce provided she pay my Daughter Sarah thirty pounds when she is

Married I likewise give and bequeath to her former two  
 Work Horses and three Cows and likewise my household  
 furniture with dividing with the girls the above men-  
 tioned Plantation at the death or marriage of my widow  
 I do give and bequeath to my beloved son Wm<sup>m</sup> Provin  
 upon his paying Rebekah my Youngest Daughter  
 thirty pounds the I likewise give and bequeath to my beloved  
 sons Alexander & John Provin the Plantation of land on  
 Station Camp in Cumberland to be Equally Divided  
 Between them I do likewise give and my claim of three  
 hundred Acres of Land on Harper to my two beloved  
 Daughters Ann & Mary to be Equally divided Between  
 them I likewise the claim of Duck River Land is to be sold  
 and Equally Divided amongst all my children Negro Sams  
 is to be continued in the family till my son Wm<sup>m</sup> is of age  
 and then to be sold and Equally Divided amongst  
 all my children I do likewise give and bequeath to my  
 beloved Brother Andrew Provin the Young boy house with  
 one Eye I likewise Allow the Remainder of the horses to  
 be sold and Equally Divided amongst all the children  
 the Remainder of the cattle is to be Divided Equally  
 Among the children the Sheep & hogs is to remain in  
 the family for their support during her Widowhood  
 and then to be sold and Equally Divided Among the  
 children the Above named Negro Girl is likewise at  
 the Marriage or Death of my Widow is to be sold and  
 Equally Divided amongst all my children last of all  
 I do appoint my wife Mary with Alexander Denny & Saml<sup>r</sup>  
 Woods to my Executors of this my last will and Testament  
 thereby Revoking all wills by me heretofore made by me  
 and in Witness Whereof I do hereunto set my hand and  
 affix my seal this 27<sup>th</sup> of February 1792

NB the before mentioned Negro Sams is to be continued in the family  
 at the Direction of the Executors

 of John Province by the Oath of Robert Henderson J. Al-  
 - and or Reed Witnesses thereto and Ordered to be Recorded

In the name of god Amine this eight day of February one  
 thousand seven hundred and ninety one Elizabeth  
 Stephenson of Madison County and State of Virginia being  
 weak of body but of Perfect mind and Memory thanks  
 be to god for it and calling to mind the mortality of my  
 body and that it is appointed for all Men to die hereby  
 constitute and Ordain this to be my last Will and  
 Testament first I recommend my soul to god who gives it  
 at death and my body to be buried in a Christian  
 like and decent manner at the Discretion of my  
 Executors and as for such Worldly goods as it hath pleased  
 god to favour me with I leave in manner following to wit  
 first I Order that all my Just Debts should be paid and next  
 that my granddaughter Jean Stephenson his ten pound out of  
 what money my son James has in his hands and the balance  
 to Joseph Hunter which is seventeen pounds four shillings  
 and sixpence it is my will that my granddaughter Jean  
 McKnight his ten pound out of the Debt of the mill and  
 that David Maxwell his the balance Also it is my will  
 that he keeps what Cows I have in his hands and David  
 them equal amongst his children all but John and  
 Elizabeth I do hereby appoint David Maxwell and
