we further Report that Mr^r Webb the Executrix and Dennis Wingen the Executor to Isaac Wingen Dec^d have agreed that all such all differences arising from this being appointed as Surrogate to the Orphans of the said Dennis Wingen Dec^d under Order of the County Court or otherwise on the following Term shall be forever forgotten and done away & that the said Dennis agrees to pay to the said Mary the within amount so soon as the within Report shall be accepted by the Court and also that the said Mary may clear and quit at her Disposition ten acres of wood land in any part of the said Isaac Wingen's land, Rent free so long as the said

Wingen Acts as Executor for said ~~Isaac~~, and it is agreed by Mary that the said Dennis shall retain in his hands the Renting the land except his ten Acre and the money belonging to the children until they arrive to age and said Dennis is to advance from time to time out of the Rents of the land the money necessary for the Schooling the children and it is the Request of the said Dennis and Mary that this should be admitted as part of our Report March 17th 1797
