cloathing and other necessary household furniture as
conveniently can be had and for the land that I claim
on that in Clarke County the whole is obtained
I give to each of my three daughters Mary Turel, Rebecca
Schot and Ann Maxwell two hundred Acres
of land on that and for the half obtained one
hundred Acres each and so in proportion to what to come
is obtained and the other part I give to my three
sons Bay, Thomas & Robert each an equal part I do
