James Coulter of Madison

James Coulter being weak in body but of sound mind and  
 memory and knowing that all flesh must decay or later give  
 unto death do ordain this my last Will and Testament  
 that all my Just debts be paid I give and bequeath  
 to my son James Coulter one hundred & seven pounds ad-  
 ding the lands of James Weston to include the place where  
 he now lives - I give and bequeath unto my beloved  
 Miss Abby Coulter the whole of my Estate, real and  
 personal except the lands named, to my son James  
 during her natural life or until she dies. It is my will  
 and request that my wife should keep and raise all our  
 family so long as they may remain with her should  
 any of them <sup>and if</sup> ~~die~~ <sup>live</sup> it is my will that my wife should  
 provide them of as they may think proper so as not  
 to exceed their share of my personal Estate at her death  
 It is my will that the residue of my Estate be equally  
 divided amongst my Children hereafter named  
 to wit James Coulter, Elizabeth Jackson, Elizabeth Coulter  
 Anna ~~James~~ <sup>James</sup> Coulter, & my wife  
 Abby Coulter, Abby Coulter and Abby Coulter. It is also  
 my will that what I have given to my Children that are  
 now married should be considered a part of their portion  
 except the land given to my son James that is to say one  
 hundred & seven pounds to my Daughter Elizabeth Jackson  
 and hundred & seven pounds to my daughter Anna James

I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Coulter a parcel of land  
 which has been commonly named to her which is to be  
 considered one hundred dollars in part of her portion of  
 my Estate. And I do hereby appoint William Miller Executor  
 and my beloved wife Abby Coulter Executors to this my  
 last Will and Testament. In Testimony Whereof I have  
 hereunto set my hand and put the 30<sup>th</sup> day of April  
 one thousand eight hundred and six.

 year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and one I Maryann  
 Child of Madison County and State of Kentucky being of sound  
 mind and perfect memory thanks to God for the same and  
 calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that  
 as appointed for all men to die do make and ordain this  
 my last Will and Testament that is to say principally

238 and first of all I give and recommend my soul to God who  
 gave it and my body I recommend it to the earth to be  
 buried in a Christian manner hoping at the resurrection  
 I will arise in perfect body and that by the almighty power  
 of God in whom I trust and trusting such words I state and  
 am satisfied with I give and dispose of the same in manner

as follows that is to say first I give to my eldest  
 daughter Sarah and my son James Samuel Wallace  
 William and Isaac including their heirs the sum of  
 five hundred Sterling pounds of my above named childrens  
 and no more my Daughter Elizabeth and John Woods  
 her husband I give a part that I have in my son James  
 Wallace Clerk for ready seven pounds also two coats  
 with their furniture also saddle and flax wheel and  
 my black service between my Daughter Elizabeth and my  
 Daughter Sarah and I do hereby utterly revoke and disannul  
 all former Testaments with and legacies by me in any way  
 made before this kind Notifying and confirming this and  
 hereby to be my last Will and Testaments Whereof I have  
 hereunto set my hands and Seal the year date above
