 last will and Testament disavowing all other wills herebefore
 by me made first and principally I give and bequeath my soul
 into the hand of almighty God who gave it me and my body
 to the earth to be buried in a Christian manner at the discre-
 tion of my Executors hereafter named and all the worldly goods
 I hath pleased God to bless me with I give devise and dispose
 of in manner and form following — — — — —
 I give and bequeath to my son Daniel Ford two
 hundred and fifty acres of land on Muddy Creek being part of
 a tract of 500 acres which I purchased of John Farant to
 him and his heirs forever. Item, I give and bequeath to my
 four Daughters Viz, Ruth Ann Judith & Sally the remaining
 two hundred and fifty acres of my land on muddy Creek to be
 equally divided between them to them and their heirs forever. Item,
 I give and bequeath to my son Joel Ford one hundred
 acres of land part of a tract of 380 acres in Buckingham County in
 Virginia also the remainder of my land in Geneva County
 on the south side of Paint Lake Creek after fifty acres shall be
 made over to Alex Moore and the expiration of a lease of
 five years to him and his heirs forever — — — — —
 Item, I give and bequeath to my son Jacob Ford one
 hundred and eighty six acres of land part of my land in
 Buckingham County in Virginia also one cow and calf to
 him and his heirs forever. Item, I give and bequeath to my

son Laban Ford one hundred acres of land being
 the remainder of my land in Buckingham County in
 Virginia to him and his heirs forever. Item, I give &
 bequeath to my step Daughter Polly Stone when she
 shall come of age or marriage one feather Bed furniture
 one Cow and half one ewe and lamb to her. Item,
 I give and bequeath to my step son Samuel
 Stone one horse of the value of twenty pounds & one
 calf to him. Item, I send to my beloved wife Sarah
 during her natural life the land and plantation whereon
 I now live together with my house hold and kitchen fur-
 niture stock of every kind plantation utensils and after
 her decease I give and bequeath to my son Peter Ford
 the land and plantation except fifty acres of land to
 be laid off at the north corner of my land which
 fifty acres of land I give to my daughter Polly if she is
 ever recovered from the Indians together with one half of
 my household and kitchen Furniture stock of every kind
 and plantation utensils and if she is never recovered from
 the Indians the whole of the land household &
 kitchen Furniture stock of every kind and plantation
 utensils to my son Peter this his forever. Item, I have
 already given my son John Ford his portion already I have
 nothing now to leave to him. Lastly I appoint my loving
 wife Sarah and my two sons Daniel & Joel to be the Executors
 of this my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I
 have hereunto set my hand and seal this 14 day of March Ann.
