Nicholas Howard Tatum my hand and possession at the death of
myself and my wife Sarah Tatum to him his heirs forever if he the said
Nicholas Howard doth keep house as a peaceable and sufficient man
independance during our natural lives. Now I give and bequeath
to my Daughter Lania Tatum one horse saddle and bridle one
Cow and calf one Father bed and furniture out of the above
mentioned Estate to her and her heirs forever

Now I give and bequeath to all the rest of my Children one dollar
each of the above mentioned Estate to them and their heirs forever -
Lastly I appoint George & Heem to be the Executors of my last Will and

233) Bonds due me In old Virginia for my Plantation I wish them to be divided among my Children as follows as they become due At the death of my Executor is my son James thirty three dollars and my daughter Amy forty Dollars and my Daughter Agnes, sixty Dollars and my Daughter Deborah fifty dollars and I wish my daughter Margaret thirty dollars and I wish my son John to get one hundred dollars and my son David one hundred dollars and I wish my daughter Polly one hundred Dollars and I wish my Grand daughter Elizabeth half the 4 dollars and I wish my Grand daughter Polly, Margaret, and Agnes to have one young mare now sown and thus after all my Debt is paid if any thing be left I wish my Executors to sell and divide equally amongst my Children and I wish and order my Trusty friend John Inceady to be my Executor Given under my hand and signed in the presence of us ^{his} April 6th 1802
