County of Madison and State of Kentucky being very Sick and
Weak or Insuperior in body but of perfect mind and many
thanks be given to god call in unto mind the mortality of my body
and knowing that it is appointed once for all men to die do
make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say
principally and first of all, I give and Recommend my body
and soul into the hands of Almighty god that gave it, and my body
to the earth in a decent and Christian burial at the discretion
of my Executors not doubting but at the general Resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of god and
as touching such worldly Estate wherewith I have pleased god to
bless me in this life, I give devise and dispose of the same in the
following manner and form. First I give and bequeath to Susanna
my dearly beloved wife all the property Real and personal which
she Remainsing Undivided, but if she should marry to have nothing
but a home so to live and her bed of such as she please to take and
that property or the Value thereof to be divided among the children
after her death as the rest and my two sons John Rabourn and
William Rabourn to convey my land that I hold in Augusta County
Virginia to John Rabourn when he shall make the payment agreeable
to the Contract, and that every thing Real and personal all
to equally Divided among my Children John Rabourn and
William Rabourn Polly Igo Elizabeth Rabourn Susanna Ra-
bourn Polly Rabourn Peggy Rabourn Rebecca Rabourn Jacob
Rabourn and Mary Rabourn and fourth that as the
Children should marry and leave her to give them such

things as he can conveniently show and keep in account of the property or the value thereof as Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 27th day of December 1805,

And I appoint my wife Executrix, Robert Rabourn

and my two sons John Rabourn and William Rabourn Executors.

which she now lives with all the household furniture during her natural life or widowhood then to all to my son Samuel Cochran to dispose of to each one an equal share of my legacies who may think best of the said real estate at a market value Also I wish Children that has not good schooling to be schooled at the discretion of my Executors Also if any of my Children should marry during my wife's life I wish them to get them parts of my personal Estate to be paid by my Executors I appoint my wife Daniel and my son Samuel my Executors of my Will and Testament in premises to all others
