Constitute and ~~make~~ ^{bequeath} this my last Will and Testament
first my Will and desire is that all my Just debts
be paid Out of my Estate by my executor that I shall
hereafter Appoint in this Will, Secondly I give and
bequeath to my beloved Wife Sarah Timberlake the
Tract of Land whereon I now live with the Appurtenances
thereunto belonging to her & her heirs forever, my Will
& desire is that after all my Just debts is paid then
the ballance of my Personal or movable Estate to be
equally Divided Between my wife Sarah Timberlake
and my Daughter Sarah Butler to them & their
heirs forever I give & bequeath unto my sons John &
Philip Timberlake twenty shillings a piece to be
paid them by Executors I no more, I do hereby Ordain
& Appoint Martin Gentry and Thomas Butler
Executors to this my last Will & Testament In
Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal
the tenth day of February in the year of our Lord one
thousand seven hundred & Ninety five
