 future Increase Except what is before given also in sett
 lish household furniture stock of horses cattle hogs &c
 to be divided Equally between my sons Except what is
 in this will divided I also give and bequeath to my
 son Peyton Robertson & William Robertson all the
 property that my wife Sarah Robertson at her decease
 may be possessed of to be equally divided between them to them
 and their heirs for ever and if any of my above Children
 should die without heirs of their Body lawfully begotten my
 will and desire is such that the part of such Child's descent
 shall be Equally divided between them my Surviving
 Children And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint
 my well beloved wife Sarah Robertson John Petman & Je-
 -cholas Hawkins Peyton Robertson & William Robertson
 my Executors & Executrix of this my last will and Testa-
 -ment hereby Revoking disannulling all former wills
 whatever by me made either by word or writing I Witness
