In the Name of God Amen - Samuel Tatum Senior of the County of Madison and State of Kentucky being full of years and memory but calling to mind the Mortality of man that he is appointed for all men once to die do make and Order this my last Will and Testament disannulling all other Wills heretofore by me made Void and principally I give and bequeath my soul unto the hands of God - A mighty God who gives to me and my body to the earth to be buried ~~in~~ in a Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and the Mortality goods that hath pleased God to bless me with I give devise and dispose of in manner and form following Infirmum I give and bequeathing son Nicholas Howard Tatum my hand and possession at the death of myself and my wife Sarah Tatum to him his heirs forever if he the said Nicholas Howard doth keep house as a peaceable and sufficient man in law during our natural lives. Now I give and bequeath to my Daughter Lania Tatum one horse saddle and bridle one Cow and calf one Father bed and furniture out of the above mentioned Estate to her and her heirs forever

Now I give and bequeath to all the rest of my Children one dollar each of the above mentioned Estate to them and their heirs forever - Lastly I appoint George & Heem to be the Executors of my last Will and Testament. In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 11th day of November A.D. 1805
