unto my beloved wife Jane Dever all my estate real
& personal to her and her heirs & assigns for ever except my
part as a legatee of the estate of John Dever Junr Deceased
which I Bequeath to Nancy Dever & John Devers widow to her
and her heirs & assigns forever. I appoint my wife Jane Dever
Joseph Kennedy & Off. Andrew Harris my executors This Sac-
knowledge to be my last will and testament revoking all
other given under my hand & seal this thirteenth day of Septe-
mber one thousand eight hundred & two.

In the Name of God amen, I, Matthew Fow-
ler of lawful age, and disposing Mind, do make & order this
my last will, and testament, revoking & disannulling all other
Imprimis I give my soul to God from whence it came &
my Body to be decently buried Item I lend to my beloved
wife Nancy my personal estate of all kind subject to the
hereafter named legacies also the plantation whereon I now
live during her widowhood and at the end of her widowhood
or should she not marry then at her death the whole of my
personal Estate to be sold and the money to be equally
divided amongst my children I have & share alike Item
I give to my son Richard Matthew Fowler a Saddle fully
with a stir in his face Item I give to my son John Fowler
a Bolt from my Estate Item I give the tract of Land whereon
I now live to be equally divided between my two sons Richard
& John to them and their heirs forever But should either of
them die before he comes of lawful age then I give it all to
surviving one Item I give my Military claim of land on
the little Kanaway of two hundred & fifty acres to be equal-
ly divided between my three sons Edward & Richard & John
to them and their heirs forever But should either of them
my two last named sons die before they come of age
then to be divided between the living ones I name
