In the name of god the Father son & Holy Ghost Amen I being of a low weak State of body but of a sound disposing Mind and Judgment having upon due Deliberation considered the Mortality of my body and the certainty of Death do make constitute and Appoint the following Arrangement to be my last Will & Testament In the first place I cheerfully commit my body to the dust to be entred at the Discretion of my Executors in the grave Yard of Silver Creek Meeting House and my Immortal Spirit in to the hands of the all Gracious god who gave it me I hope of its Resurrection to Eternal life at the last day I Prunish with that all my whole full Estate be Discharged togeather with my funeral expences

I Give and Bequeath to my dear & well beloved wife Isabella all the Liberties & Privileges that may or shall hereafter Arise from the Plantation that I now live on during her Widowhood and I do for ever give her all my farming Tools all all Beds and furniture Dresser and all that pertains to it together with all my House hold stuff the Crop of Corn now in the ground with a sufficient Quantity of meat for the support of my family for one Year likewise one Horse and saddle eight cows & the calves pick of my Stock all the sheep and hogs that pertains to me

I Give and Bequeath to my dear & well beloved Daughter Mary Mason one Parcel of Land to be heirs at this time and thirty five pounds in Cash to be paid to her when she comes of Age

I Give & Bequeath to my dear & well beloved Son John Mason one gray mare and thirty five pounds Cash and my Plantation at Paint Lick

I Give & Bequeath to my dear & well beloved Daughter Isabella thirty five pounds Cash

6th I give & bequeath to my well beloved son James Mason the lands on which I now live the whole of it together with thirty five pounds cash

7th I give and bequeath to my well beloved Daughter Sarah Mason one half & thirty five pounds cash

8th I give and bequeath to the child my wife is now big with one hundred & thirty five pounds cash if a boy and if a girl thirty five pounds in cash

9th all the lands that I have any right title or claim unto in the State of Virginia and County of Abbot's I do desire that my Brother James Mason be Invested with full power and Authority to Dispose of the lands Above mentioned and by this my will together with the power that is now in his hands and the Confidence that I have heretofore Reposed in him and do now repose in him that he my May Dispose the said ~~Properties~~ ^{Properties} to the Best Advantage for cash and that the profits thereof may be sent to my Legacies in due time.

10th I give and bequeath an Equal Dividend to my Children Sons & Daughters without Exception of all that may Remain of my Estate when called.

11th I authorize my trusty friends & Brothers & my well beloved wife, John Courman, & Matthew Scott to see that this my last will and Testament be executed according to the true intent & meaning of & do declare this to be my last will & Testament signed & sealed in the presence of us
