

I Abraham Lewis of Madison County and state of Kentucky do hereby make this my last will and Testament in manner and form following, first I desire that as much of my principal part of my estate be amouably sold after my decess as will pay and satisfy all my lawful debts and funeral expences 2^d after the payment of my debts and funeral expences 3^d I give to my son Joseph Lewis all that tract or parcel of land containing one hundred and sixty acres and all the pertances thereon where he now lives in ~~Madison County~~ Main County Indiana Territory to him and his heirs forever Also fifty dollars in Cash to him and his heirs forever 4th I give to my son Isaac Lewis all that tract or parcel of land containing one hundred and sixty acres and the premises thereon where he now lives in Main County Indiana Territory to him and his heirs forever. Also fifty dollars in Cash to him and his heirs forever.

5th I give to my son Thomas Lewis all that tract or parcel of land containing one hundred and sixty acres and premises thereon in Main County Indiana Territory the north east quarter of section the ninth town ship the twelfth range the first to him & his heirs forever also fifty dollar in Cash to him and his heirs forever also one two year old steed att to him and his heirs forever 6th I give to my son Abram Lewis one hundred acres

of the land where he now lives including the improvements where I live being two hundred acres in the whole the dividing line to run nearly a west course giving my son Abram Lewis one hundred acres with all the prunings thereon to him and his heirs forever also one father land and furniture and fifty dollars in cash to him and his heirs forever also one horse that he shall choose out of my stock one plough and two set of Iron spurs to four horses of the waggon also one cow and calf also six good killing hogs one open saugh

8th I give and bequeath to my wife Esther Lewis all the house hold furniture both kitchen and household and leave two hundred dollars in the hands of ^{my} executors hereafter named to put out on interest and my wife to have the interest of the same for her own use as she may see need also all the provisions that is on hand and that shall be made the on the place this present season to go to the benefit of the family at home.

9th I give to my Daughter Betsey Hollis and my daughter Polly White one hundred and sixty acres of land lying in Main County Indiana Territory the south west section Township the Twelfth being the first the above to be Equally to be divided in quantity and quality to them and their heirs forever.

9th I give to my daughter Susanah Bell one hundred and thirty dollars in Cash to her and her heirs forever. 10th I give and be to my daughter Ester wain one hundred and thirty dollars in Cash to her and her heirs forever; 11th I give to my daughter Bechey Elton six shillings in Cash to her and her heirs forever.

12th I give to Melly may Berry one hundred Dollars in Cash to her and her heirs forever— The ballance and all my estate to be sold to the best bid at twelve months Credit and equally divided among my nine children, I constitute and appoint to this my last will and Testament my son Thomas Lewis Nathaniel Mann to be my executor of the same.
