ordain this to be my last Will and Testament in the
following manner, I first and principally I recommend
my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it
me, and my body to the Earth to be buried in a decent
and Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors
hereafter named. And as to that worldly Estate I have
pleased God to bless me with I dispose of in the following manner
Wiz: I purpose that all my last debts and
funeral expences be first paid

Then I give unto my dearly beloved wife Maryann Crooke
the plantation I now dwell containing one hundred acres by
deed to the same more or less and the said land to be by her freely
enjoyed and possessed during her being a Widow, and if she
marry or at her death my desire is that the said tract of
land be equally divided between my two eldest sons in quantity
and quality, namely Zachariah Crooke and Reziniah
Crooke to remain to them and their heirs forever also I give
and bequeath unto my dearly beloved wife Maryann Crooke
one negro girl that I have a bond for upon the same
Her death

388/ Hendricks to be by her freely enjoyed and possessed during
 her life at her death my desire is that the said negro Girl shall
 be left to my son John Crooke to him and his heirs forever
 she and her increase. Item I give unto my daughters
 Betsey Crooke Polly Crooke and Sally Crooke one feather bed
 and furniture to each of them equal to those of their former
 sisters who is married and gone from me, together with each
 of them a good cow and calf, the above mentioned property
 to be delivered to them at the day of their or either of them
 Marriages, or at the ages of twelvemonth if they so long
 remain single, and all the rest of my property is to be my
 wife during her life time and at her death to be equally
 divided among my children. And as for my daughter Anna
 Strong Chase better & Sally Pollard, I consider I have given them
 their equal share of my estate so far, until my wife's death and
 after her death the property to be equally divided among all my
 children, Anna Strong and Isaac better and Sally Pollard and
 Zachariah Crooke and Hezekiah Crooke and Wm Crooke
 and Polly Crooke and Sally Crooke and John Crooke
 and lastly I constitute and appoint my wife Maryann Crooke
 and Zachariah Crooke and Hezekiah Crooke, my two sons to
 be the whole and Executors of this my last Will and Testament
 left at their own discretion without giving security or having
