I Thos Estill of Madison County and State of Kentucky
do make and ordain the following to be my last will &
testament hereby revoking all others first of all I give and
bequeath to my loving wife Jane Estill one third part of all my
lands that I may die possessed of during her natural life
and at her death the above named land I give and bequeath
to my son Samuel Estill I also give to my wife Jane Estill
my two Negro women Hannah and Delph and one small
Negro girl named Hannah during her natural life and at
her death to be disposed of in the following manner
Delph and her increase I give and bequeath at the death of
Jane Estill to my daughter Nancy Walker and her children
the other two (both Hannah by name) I leave to my wife
Jane Estill at her death to give either to my son Samuel
Estill or to my daughter Nancy Walker which ever she
may think proper I also give my wife Jane Estill one bay
horse mare and her colt which colt is now in the possession
of John Walker I also give my wife Jane two cows and calves
She to have choice out of my Stock also two Bees and furniture
Secondly I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy
Walker one black mare three years old last spring and
one yearling colt now in possession of her husband James

I, James Estill do hereby give and bequeath to my son James Estill the Balance and residue of my Estate both Real and personal that is to say all my lands Horses Cattle Hogs Sheep waggon and goods Bowcholer and Kitchen furniture farming tools &c and the crop at present on my farm together with my negro man Eggs including every other species of property herein not named and not specially bequeathed other ways and lastly I hereby nominate and appoint my wife Jane Estill and my son James Estill to execute this my last will and Testament and placing full confidence in them I order that no account be required of them in executing this will nor is it my desire that any of my Estate be appraised or an inventory taken of the same I witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 13th day of
