area and sixty eight Dollars and its interest to be equally
divided to them as they come of age or money.

I am I give also all the money that my property
will fetch that can be spared and its interest to my
three children to be divided as is here stated. I am I
give unto my beloved wife Polly Anderson all the rest
of my property forever I appoint Joseph Sankusky my
executor to this my last will and testament. In Witness
