 One good first rate each and every of them to have one first rate Horse
 Bridle and Saddle and a first rate suit of clothes I give and bequeath
 to my Daughter Nancy my negro Slave James and her two children
 James and Jude and Charlot and good a first rate mare Bridle and
 Saddle and good Horse clothes as you shall know full I give and bequeath
 to daughter Tabitha my negro Slave Betty and her two children Dina
 and Joseph and a Chany ames daughter and David daughter and
 good first rate mare Bridle Saddle and good Horse clothes as you shall
 think know full My daughter Polly married to John Turner I have
 given her her part of my Estate except fifty pounds that will make her
 equal with the other children the Tax was satisfied with that
 I have given him before this was written the remainder of my estate
 both land and personal estate I have to be sold except Sam and his wife
 Sarah and or children them my wife will take to raise the children during
 her widowhood the property that you think can be spared give one year
 credit my three sons William Peter and Samuel it is my desire they
 should go to School until they have got a sufficiency of Mathematics
 and Daughters until they can read well my sons to be put to some good
 trade at the age of seventeen and be brought up in fear God all the
 money arising from the sales of my Estate is to be equally divided after
 paying for Schooling and clothing my children except one hundred
 pounds more than the others to make his land equal with his brothers
 the above mentioned one hundred pounds is to be paid to my son
 Peter Taylor and be further understood that if anything be in

the within writing or above the Children be not contented they shall
 have the same to Executors and have no law between ~~but~~ other by this
 I do revoke all my former Wills and do hereby appoint my good friends
 William Swins and Hali Talbot my Executors of this my last will
 and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand &
 affixed my seal this twenty day of June in the year of our Lord one
 thousand eight hundred and seven
