Revoking all others so appoint this my Last Will and
Testament. That is to say, principally and first of all: I
give and recommend to my Soul into the Hand of Almighty
God that gave it, and say Myself I recommend to the Death
to be buried in decent Christian Burial, at the discretion of
my Executors, nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God
And as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased
God to bless me in this life: I give devise and dispose of
the same in the following manner and form. First it is my
Will that all my lawful debts be paid. Also I give and
Bequeath to my Beloved wife Jane Prime all the Estate
I got with her in Marriage, To-wit, three hundred acres of
Land in Washington County which Land she the said Jane
lived on when we were married, which her former husband
John Hardin Miller her and also negroes Peter and ~~James~~
also her bed and furniture and all other house hold fur-
niture that I got with her that now remain in my posses-
sion, two Beds and some other things she has given away
also of my own property I give and Bequeath unto my
Beloved wife one bay horse by the name of Sam, and feather
bed and furniture two of my work Horses To-wit, Milley and
Duck two plows one large and the other small with great
compleat for two Horses three milk cows & their calves, her
choice of my Stock of Cattle one of my best Steers ten
heads of Hogs and six head of Sheep her choice all the
above articles to her and her Heirs forever. I also give
her ten pounds in money to be raised out of my Estate
I also give her my plantation whereon I now live and

my Beloved wife during her natural life and at her decease to
David C. Irons son of Christopher Irons deceased to him and his
Heirs forever I also give unto my Beloved my wife Jane three
negroes To-wit, Milley, her child Moses and a boy named Abner
Milley and Abner to serve till they are twenty one years of age
then to be emancipated according to the Laws now in force for the
purpose of emancipating negroes and when the said Milley becomes
free it is my Will and desire that her child Moses should also be
liberated to go free with his Mother and if said Milley should
have any other issue before the time of her manumission it is my
Will that they also should go free with their Mother but if
the said Milley should not be able to maintain her children
it is my desire they should be bound out according to Laws of
this State made for the purpose of binding out white orphans
children. - And I give and Bequeath the other part of

of my Land on which I now live (namely Curlew place to David Brown son of Christopher Brown deceased adjoining my Land as above Miller and Bequeathed to my Beloved wife Beginning at the above mentioned stake tree marked four ways and standing in John Patricks line thence with said Patricks line to the Press corner a black oak thence with said Press line passing his Sugar House twenty poles to Catharine Pattersons corner in said Press line thence with said Pattersons line to where the divide line between the two tracts Intersects said Pattersons line thence with that line to the Beginning to him and his heirs forever provided he the said David Brown will pay to each of his Sons, To wit, Fanny Calaworth and Mary Stark one hundred pounds good and lawful money of Kentucky one moiety to be paid at my decease and the balance at my wifes decease

Item I give and bequeath to Margaret Pace the tract of Land I bought of John Wright and also an addition of twenty acres adjoining said tract and also adjoining Catharine Pattersons Survey the whole supposed to be about fifty acres to her and her heirs forever also at the decease of my wife I give and Bequeath unto Margaret Pace twelve ^{silver} ~~silver~~ ^{table} ~~table~~ spoons all marked C. M. I to her and her heirs forever Item I give and bequeath unto William Irvine son of Robert Irvine two hundred and twenty eight acres of Land whereon John James now lives lying on the Caney fork of the ~~Cane~~ ^{Cane} fork of Otter creek and adjoining David Brownes Land on the West and Samuel Pattersons on the North to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and Bequeath unto Thomas & John Pittman all the remainder of my claims of Land not already

Bequeathed To wit, one tract on the round Stone fork of Rockcastle containing about 1,780 acres one fourth of which is mine the remainder belonging to William Irvine Junr and David Brown also one other tract of about 2,000 acres on the Brushy fork of Silver creek one fourth belonging to me the other 3/4 to Green Blay and William Irvine Junr also two other tracts on the waters of Round Stone creek containing about 4,100 acres one fourth belonging to me the other 3/4 to Green Blay and William Irvine Junr to them and their heirs forever

Item I give and Bequeath unto Christopher Pittman son of Thomas Pittman one feather bed and furniture to him & his heirs forever. Item I give and Bequeath unto Polly Pace

one feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever

Item I give unto William Irvine Junr my best Iron pot Rack to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and Bequeath unto my beloved wife all the remainder of my household and Kitchen furniture during her natural life and at her decease to be

Divided equally Between John Pittman Margaret Pace and William Irvine Junr to them and their heirs forever

Item If I am possessed of any money or have any debts at my decease it must be put to the use of maintaining my decrepit man Roger excepting one hundred and five Dollars due me from Samuel Thompson which I give unto my beloved wife

Item It is my desire and I do hereby emancipate all my Slaves hereafter named to wit, Brasar, Bartlett, George, Greenock, Judah, Dinah, Ann, Milley, Abner, Molley, Peter, Little, Rachael, M. Shington, Charles & Minney, Charles &

to serve each of them five years to be hired out or otherwise as
my Executors shall think fit and the money arising from their
hire to be applied by my Executors to maintain my old infirm
negro Roger and if there be any surplus remaining at his
death my Executors may have it for their trouble.

Item I direct that all my Stock of Horses, Cattle, Hogs & Sheep
not already bequeathed be sold by my Executors at
twelve months credit and fifty pounds of the money aris-
ing from the Sales bequeathed unto my Beloved Sister
Margaret Minor to her and her heirs (by John Gile) forever
The balance I give unto my beloved Brother John Petrus
and his heirs forever. Item I direct my wagon and
hind geers to be sold and the money arising from the same
to be given to Samuel A. Bacon. Item I give and
bequeath all my Books to be equally ^{in number} divided between my
Beloved wife and my friend John Pace. Item It is my
Will and desire that my negroes should continue as Slaves
after my decease until the crop on hand is taken and
taken care of and of said crop I will and bequeath
unto my Beloved wife one hundred Barrels of Corn and
Fifty Bushels of Wheat and also I give to each of my
negroes above named and to be emancipated I give ^{him} Barrels
of Corn & each that is over ten years old an hog and an
axe and all of them to be fully clothed at the expense of
my Estate. Item I do request as the last favour of my
Exors that all my negroes may be emancipated and
those who are under age if their parents are not able
to raise them should be bound out according to the Law
providing for the binding out White Orphan children.

And it is my Will that my negro girl Molly should be bound
to my Sister Margaret Minor till she arrives to the age of
twenty and provided she will have her learned to read but
if said Sister should decease before the said negro girl
Molly arrives to the age of twenty and she is to be free and
not compelled to serve any other person And last of all I
constitute and ordain William Irvine and John Pace my
whole and Executors of this my Last Will and Testament
under my hand and Seal this 17th day of April 1811

my Last Will and Testament in writing bearing date April

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Brother John Petrus all my wearing apparel

Black mare and her increase. Item I direct and bequeath
my Executors to make debts to any hands that I am in

obligations to make. And my Will and meaning is that
this Council or this Schedule be and be adjudged to be part and
parcel of my Last Will and Testament and that all things
herein mentioned and contained be faithfully and truly per-
formed and obfully and amply ~~in manner~~ in every respect
as if the same were so declared and set down in my said
Last Will and Testament. Witness my hand and seal this day
