 should be any money or property to spare When any of my
 children becomes of age that they should have a small por-
 tion and so on to the youngest - Thirdly my will and
 desire is that after the expiration of the life of the said

Margary My wife, that there should be an equal division of
 all my estate both real and personal between all my Children
 by names, Anne and David Smith John William Delley
 Martha Elizabeth Rachel - James & David Smith also to my
 Wifes daughter Emory Blackley to have equal part with my
 children - Also my desire is that if there is any money now in
 hand and any money that shall be hereafter collected belonging
 to my estate to be paid ^{but} to the best advantage for the use of my
 family - I do hereby Order and appoint Margary Smith Executrix
 and John Dunkin & John Mortimer Executors
 to this my last will and testament -
