 all and every thing that is my property at my death
 and it is my will and Desire that after the Death of my wife
 that my Son James Leggett shall
 possess the whole except fifteen ^{pounds} to Abijah my Son all
 fifteen pounds to Susannah Leggett for my Son James
 Leggett to pay out of the above mentioned property
 also five Shillings to my Daughter Polly Howard
 to my daughter Marciess Hoy five Shillings each
 to my Daughter Martha Ford Betty Shaw George her
 what remains also to my Son John Leggett three

 Dollars I bequeath and appoint Thomas Watts and James
 Leggett my executors to this my last Will and Testament I

 found Burke and Leggett all Wills made previous to this
 Date Given under my hand and Seal this Twenty third

 hundred and eight
