Hill after my wife ~~shall~~ decease the plantation which I have already made him a claim to and all my good Bed and furniture and all my farming tools also one cow and one calf I term I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Hill two good beds with good furniture also one cow and Heifer yearling and one cow also one fallow Table one Earthen Dish and one pitcher three earthen plates and one Sattullen also one Spinning wheel and two chairs also one bay mare and colt also one cow and tackling and one spinning wheel and two chairs also one cow I term I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Eleanor Hill two good beds and good furniture also my black mare and colt also one cow and tackling and one spinning wheel and two chairs also one cow I term I give and Bequeath unto my son William Hill one cow and Lamb I term I give and Bequeath unto my grand daughter Polly Rucker one brumel Bed and furniture I term I give unto my grand Daughter Nancy Hill one half quartering also one cow and lamb and the Balance of my estate to be sold and when all my just debts are paid the balance to be divided between my three daughters Nancy Rucker Fanny Woods and Patsey Maupin and I do appoint my sons John S. Hill and John Black to be my sole and sole Executors of this my last will and testament which my hand this 30th day of September 1811

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Stephenson of Madison County Kentucky farmer being in perfect mind and memory thank be given unto God calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say Principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul in the hands of all mighty god that gave it and my body I recommend to earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of god and as touching such worldly estate where with it has pleased god to bless me within this life of mine and distress of in the following manner and form - first of all I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife all my real and personal estate during her life after my just debts are paid Also I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Stephenson one acre bag named after our father Dead and furniture and one shot to her heirs forever also I give my son John Stephenson Joseph Stephenson Nancy Long Catherine Patton Elizabeth Stephenson Nathan H Stephenson Nicholas H Stephenson and Thomas Stephenson an equal share of my estate except what is above willed

to Elizabeth Stephenson last of all I appoint my two Sons John and Nathan H Stephenson my executors and do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every former testament will legacies bequests and executors by me and in any way before named will and bequeath ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 4th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twelve Signed sealed published pronounced and declared by the said Thomas Stephenson as his last will and Testament in the presence of us who in his presence and in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names
